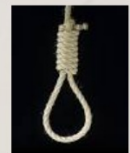

**Learning Gain:**

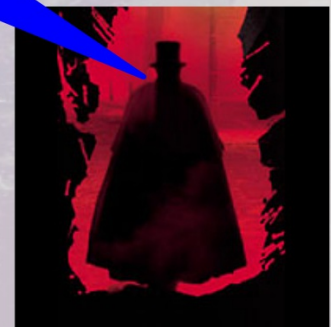

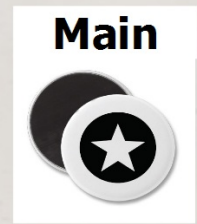
